Eric Baeni, shown here with Alphonse's daughter Sothia, manages the children's correspondenace project in Goma and is dedicated to serving others in many ways.


Recently he was attacked with a machete and robbed in his home. He needed a lot of stitches and antibiotics but seems to be recovering well.


His phone and laptop were among the goods stolen, which is going to make his university study more difficult.
